The Evolution of Stress was presented in 1979 at the Organization Development National Meeting in Snowmass, CO. It portrays the progression of the human story, and its gradual movement out of a deep communion with life and into the modern world. Based on images that were emerging in my awareness at the time, it weaves our individual evolution into that of the human race, and shows how culture and its stories shape the mind of a little child.

The presentation is offered in silence, and remains unchanged except for updated title pages and some condensation. In Part I, titled The Evolution of Stress, several photographers and artists shine a light on the gradual distancing of people from one another, the loneliness and increasing poverty of human relationships, especially in the last 150 years. It also mirrored the fragmentation of our culture at the time—and the growing fragmentation of my own soul.

Part II, The Way, begins with a caption, "The Turning Point," and signals a change. Its images reflect a growing awareness and reflect some means of learning to see and to live in a new way. At the time, I had no words to express what was inwardly gestating: I'd barely begun the second half of the journey, and much of it was intuited. It took thirty years for the words to come and be given form in the book, Awakening the Energies of Love.

If you'd like to come with me, I invite you to let go of the day's tasks, the constant effort to understand, and settle back in a comfortable chair. Then, instead of trying to 'figure out' the meaning of the images, just watch them as they pass. If you do, you're more likely to have an immediate, visceral experience of the ever-increasing time pressure, tension, and alienation that humanity has experienced since our simple beginnings . . . and then a turning . . . followed by an emerging sense of peace.


